German Family Rescued from Sailboat Foundering in the Atlantic

The crew of the APL owned container ship Hyundai Japan braved 25 knot winds and 15 foot waves to rescue a family of four—including a 5 year old and 18 month old—from the clutches of the Atlantic Ocean

1,600 miles from New York City June 9, 2008.

The Hyundai Japan, a Singapore flagged vessel and participant in the Amver system on long term charter from APL to Hyundai, overheard a distress call from the family aboard their 35 foot sailboat Dally On. The family was sailing from Antigua to the Azores when their boat was demasted and lost its rudder in a severe storm.

“They were in dire straits, so I said ‘I’m coming,’” explained Captain Parvez Guard, a 28 year veteran of APL and captain of the massive container ship.

While it took three tries, Captain Guard was able to bring his 980 foot ship alongside the stricken sailboat. Thirty-seven-



year-old crewmember Anthony Gomez-Stalin then scrambled down a pilot's ladder from the APL ship to the yacht. He snatched the 18-month-old infant in his arm and carried her up the ladder to safety. The other family members followed one-after-the-other. Within an hour of receiving the first distress call the survivors were safely aboard the Hyundai Japan and Captain Guard was steaming towards New York harbor.

United States Coast Guard representatives were on hand as the Hyundai Japan pulled into port and gave a special

commendation to Captain Guard and his crew for their efforts. “The crew acted in such a way as to ensure no call for help goes unanswered,” said Coast Guard Captain John Healey in presenting the commendation to APL. “On behalf of the United States Coast Guard we thank you for your outstanding seamanship and unwavering commitment to safety of life at sea.”



Amver and Pole Star Partner to Increase Safety at Sea

“Hope is the last thing to die... for those who find themselves in perilous conditions on our oceans, it's important they know a fellow mariner will come to their aid” stated Nicholas Pappadakis, INTER-CARGO chairman and board member of the Union of Greek Shipowners, as he commented on a unique partnership between Amver and Pole Star that will significantly increase the number of ships available to assist mariners in distress.

Starting this May, all vessels registered in Pole Star's Fleet Management service will be able to automatically report to the Amver sys-

tem at no cost to the operator or Amver. Pole Star, a maritime software company that tracks ships for owners, operators and charterers, was approached by Amver in 2007 and asked if they could make modifications to their software to allow for automated Amver reporting.

INTERTANKO are in support for this partnership as well. Capt. Howard Snaith, Director stated "INTERTANKO fully recognizes the huge benefits the Amver program has towards the safety of life at sea and is particularly pleased to learn of Amver's new human element approach towards continuous develop-

ment by decreasing the administrative burden on the Master.”



North Korean Ship Sinks Near Venezuela



On April 15, 2008 the M/V Aegean Angel was contacted by the United States Coast Guard and requested to divert approximately 157 nautical miles north of Venezuela to investigate the EPIRB of the North Korean flagged vessel Tel Tale II.

The master immediately diverted his ship and upon spotting survivors in a life raft ordered to crew to

begin rescue operations. Thankfully the 11 crewmembers of the North Korean flagged vessel were rescued.

In addition to the Aegean Angel, United States Coast Guard aircraft from Puerto Rico were launched as well.

Belgian Ambassador Receives Amver Award

The United States Coast Guard Cutter Katherine Walker hosted a Belgian delegation, June 11, 2008 including Ambassador Johan Verbeke, Permanent Representative of Belgium to the United Nations, who received special recognition for Belgium's participation in the Amver search and rescue system. Amba-

sador Verbeke accepted the award on behalf of the Belgian maritime community.

Belgium has most of its flagged merchant vessels enrolled in the humanitarian search and rescue system. Some vessels have been participating 30 years or longer.



The Right Place At The Right Time; Amver Teams Up With Norwegian Dawn To Rescue 2

What are the chances a ship would be near two emergencies at sea within hours of each other? Two sailors may want to play the lottery because they were both rescued by the cruise ship Norwegian Dawn in separate incidents Monday June 30.

The first rescue, 210 miles off the coast of Cape Cod, Mass., involved the sailboat Patriot, on its way back from Bermuda where it competed in the Newport Bermuda race. One of Patriot's crewmembers was suffering from shock like symptoms and needed to be evacuated immediately.

Using the Amver system, United States Coast Guard rescue coordinators located the Bahamian flagged cruise ship Norwegian Dawn.

Norwegian Dawn, owned by Norwegian Cruise Line, was only 52 miles away when they received the request to divert. The United States Coast Guard also launched a HU25 Falcon aircraft, from Air Station Cape Cod, Mass., to provide additional support for the rescue operation.

Norwegian Dawn Captain Trygve Vorren skillfully maneuvered the 965 foot cruise ship alongside the 40 foot sailboat and ordered a small boat lowered. Despite winds up to 35 knots and waves over five feet

the crew of Norwegian Dawn was able to embark the ill sailor without difficulty where he was treated for dehydration by the ships doctor.

When he learned of the rescue operations Stephen Furnary, owner of Patriot and Chairman and CEO of ING Clarion Partners, said, "The performance of the United States Coast Guard and Amver program was exemplary and worked well in

participating in the Newport Bermuda race, sustained a head injury and was losing consciousness.

United States Coast Guard search and rescue coordinators again turned to the Amver system and found Norwegian Dawn the closest and most appropriate vessel for the case.

"That's the beauty of the Amver system" said Captain David McBride, United States Coast Guard Chief of Search and Rescue, "It allows search and rescue coordinators to locate the best suited ship for the emergency which, in this case, was a cruise ship with a doctor on board."

Norwegian Dawn, owned by Norwegian Cruise Line of

Within twelve hours of rescuing the first person Captain Vorren was notified of another, potentially more serious, injury on the sailboat Misty approximately 260 miles south of Montauk, N.Y. A crewmember aboard the Misty, which was also returning from Bermuda after par-

Amver, sponsored by the United States Coast Guard, is a unique computer based, voluntary ship reporting system used worldwide by search and rescue authorities to arrange for assistance to persons in distress at sea. With Amver, rescue coordinators can identify participating ships in the area of distress and divert the best suited ship to respond.

Amver's mission is to quickly provide search and rescue authorities, on demand, accurate information on the positions and characteristics of vessels near a reported distress.
